*Generative Commons Living Lab is a three-year (February 2019 to January 2022) European project funded by Horizon 2020 which aims at supporting generative commons around Europe in three ways:*

- 1) Build a digital platform for collaboration that will map citizens' initiatives as well as those Public Institutions engaged in new forms of partnership with local communities.*
- 2) Share experiences by evaluating a group of pilot cases in order to understand which factors make self-organised experiences sustainable and Public Institutions helpful for their development.*
- 3) Make a toolkit using the results of the evaluation for scaling up sustainable generative commons and innovative local policies.*
