Generative Commons Living Lab is a three-year (February 2019 to January 2022) European project funded by Horizon 2020 which aims at supporting generative commons around Europe in three ways:

- 1) Build a digital platform for collaboration that will map citizens' initiatives as well as those Public Institutions engaged in new forms of partnership with local communities.
- 2) Share experiences by evaluating a group of pilot cases in order to understand which factors make self-organised experiences sustainable and Public Institutions helpful for their development.
- 3) Make a toolkit using the results of the evaluation for scaling up sustainable generative commons and innovative local policies.

The partners of the project are the Universities of Turin, Newcastle, and Barcelona, Open Lab Athens, Community Land Trust Brussels, Patrizia di Monte, Eutropian, and Spazi Indecisi.
